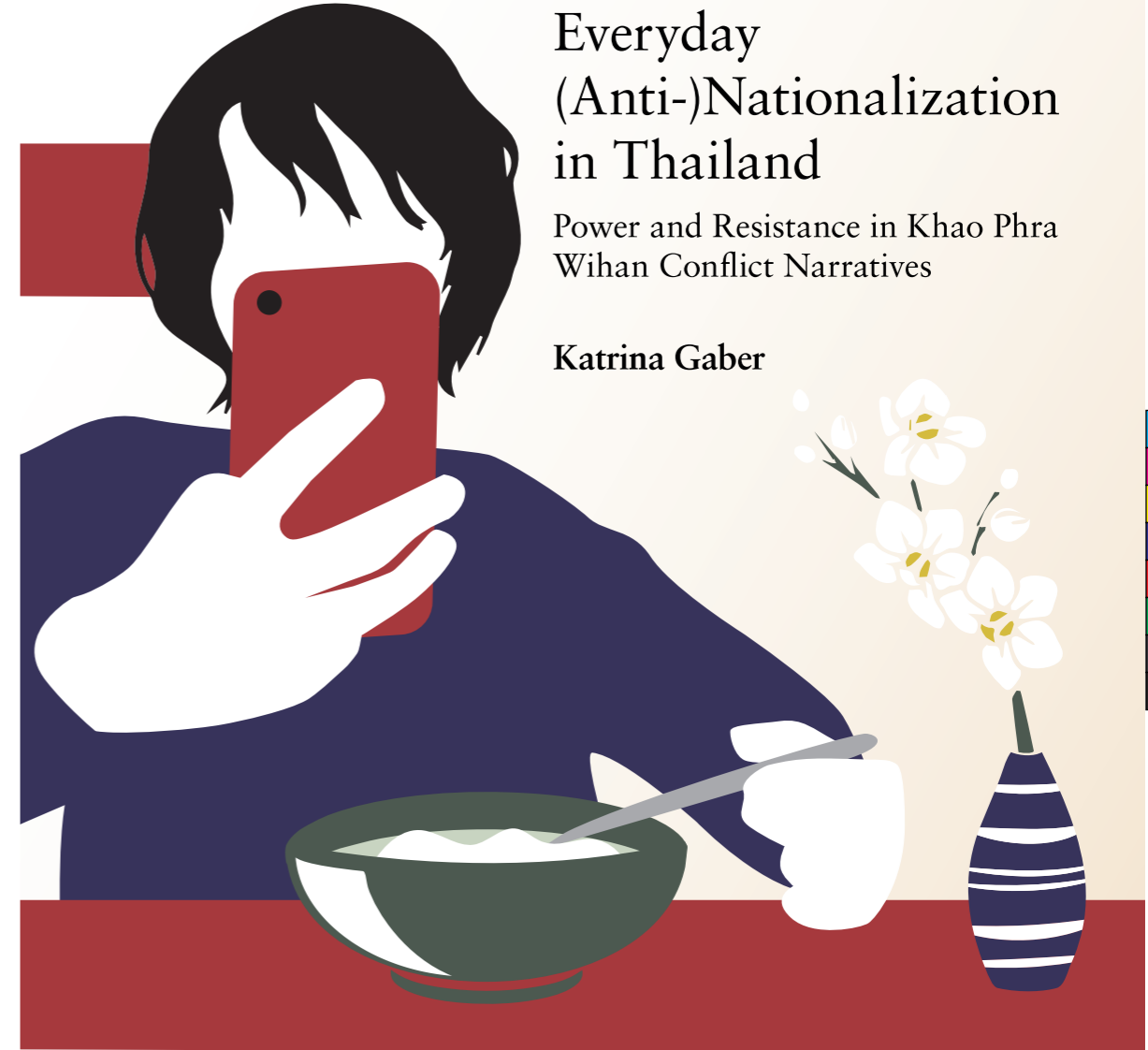

This PhD thesis explores how individuals through social practices sustain, challenge and activate Thai nationalism. In particular, the analysis examines how interlocutors describe everyday forms of power and resistance vis-à-vis the nation in conflict narratives around the Khao Phra Wihan temple in the contested border area between Thailand and Cambodia. The thesis generates new insights on everyday nationalizing by theorizing nationalist emotional socialization and suggesting new conceptualizations of both everyday resistance *against* nationalism and everyday resistance *through* nationalism.
